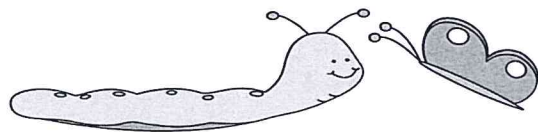

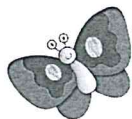

## ABOUT THE SPEAKERS

**FELDER RUSHING**, a former Extension Service urban horticultural specialist, is a tenth-generation southern gardener who maintains an overstuffed, quirky cottage garden that has no turf grass, just plants, yard art and "people places." He is the author of 18 gardening books and has written thousands of gardening columns in syndicated newspapers. Having been featured in many magazines as well as appearing on HGTV and the Discovery Channel, he hosts a weekly gardening program on MPB Think Radio. Felder currently writes and travels extensively for lectures from both his cottage in Mississippi and a farmhouse in England's rural Midlands near Wales.

**CHARLES ALLEN, PhD.** a biology professor at the University of Louisiana at Monroe before retiring, is currently a botanist at Fort Polk. He is the co-author of several books on native plants, the latest being *Louisiana Wildflower Guide*. He and his wife Susan operate Allen Acres B & B, a nature-oriented facility with gardens specifically designed to attract butterflies and hummingbirds as well as numerous other birds.

**ROBIN BRIDGES** has a B.S. Degree from Louisiana Tech and a M.S. from LSU. He served as County Agriculture Agent at the LSU AgCenter for 20 years and for the past seven years has been the County Agent for the University of Arkansas in Union County. His work over many years has taught him that people often have the same problems and questions about gardening, lawns and landscaping so he finds addressing a group to be an expedient way to be of help.

**MICKEY LOWE** designed and constructed the Butterfly Conservatory which is a major attraction at the festival each year. With his wide knowledge of butterflies, his presence in the conservatory during the festival to answer questions and point out things of interest is invaluable. His handy-man expertise can be depended on to solve any problems that arise throughout the year as we prepare for the festival.
